Our presentation reveals our approach to conserving endangered species through research, monitoring, and education. With a strong focus on turtles, snakes, bats, and wolves, we delve into the techniques employed to capture, mark, and track these wonderful creatures, providing insight into behaviors, movement patterns, population sizes, and home ranges. 	

FURTHER INFORMATION

ASK THE NATURALIST: An information table on various subjects surrounding Killbear's ecology or history. Come by any time during the designated hours to learn from a Park Naturalist.

GUIDED HIKE: A 60–90-minute program that looks at different aspects of Killbear by foot. It is recommended that you wear proper footwear, bring water, sunscreen, and bug spray to these programs.

KIDS PROGRAM: An interactive program for children aged 5-12. Children must be accompanied by a guardian.

EVENING PROGRAM: A 45–60-minute presentation that is geared towards people of all ages.

The **DISCOVERY CENTRE** is open daily from 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

SNAKE TALK is provided every day at the Discovery Centre at 2:00pm, except on Wednesdays, when the snakes have just eaten.
